## \$156 CARING CLUB® LEVEL

- 10** Speech therapy sessions for a deaf or hard-of-hearing child;
- 3** Unemployed adults get job readiness training; or
- 2** Months of counseling sessions to help heal an abused child and their non-offending care giver

## \$365 ONE DOLLAR A DAY

- 3** At-risk youth have their disputes mediated by a neutral third-party in a safe environment, limiting their exposure to the juvenile justice system;
- 1** Individual living in poverty benefits from legal aid restricting erroneous information from their criminal record, allowing more access to jobs and housing; or
- 3** Month supply of free or discounted prescription medications for a low-income adult living with chronic disease

## \$1200 LEADERSHIP GIVING

- 1** Full year of structured before and after school care for a young student;
- 3** Months of supportive services to transition a family from homelessness to independence; or
- 1** Month of adult day care for a low-income senior with dementia
